APPLICATION PROCEDURES

Applications may be completed electronically using the "fillable PDF form" or may be printed as a blank form and handwritten. If handwritten, each letter and word must be legible to qualify for consideration. All parts of the application must be completed. Submit your completed application packet electronically via email or by mail postmarked no later than March 15, 2017, to the PDK Scholarship Representative identified above. Do NOT send the application to your school. All complete applications that are submitted by March 15 will be reviewed by a chapter screening committee that has until April 1 to forward its top two applications to PDK International to be entered into competition for an international scholarship (awarded separately from the chapter scholarship).

APPLICATION GUIDELINES

- Goals Statement You have decided as a goal that you want to become a teacher. Please share your vision as to what that means to you and how you see yourself accomplishing this goal. Space is provided for your response at the end of the application (about 100 words or less). Be sure to include the name of the college/university you plan to attend and confirm that you plan to enroll no later than the following Fall semester (i.e., Fall 2017).
- **Reference Letter** Please submit one letter of recommendation. The letter must be from a person familiar with your academic abilities and school activities. The letter should also address your interest in teaching and the qualities that will make you a successful educator. The letter must accompany the application.
- **Transcript** Request a copy of your high school transcript from your school counselor. Your transcript must include class size, class rank, and grade point average. The transcript may be attached to the application or may be sent separately to the chapter representative. In any case, the transcript must be submitted to the chapter scholarship representative **no later than March 15**.

Sandra Joy Crowther Scholarship – Students with demonstrated financial need who are planning to pursue careers in education at any level in any subject. <u>If this box is checked, you must include a copy of your FAFSA form.</u>

Gabbard Memorial Scholarship – Preference to students from Ohio or Florida.

Gough Memorial Scholarship - Students entering college to study journalism or English who will teach.

Holm Memorial Scholarship – Students from California who are pursuing education careers, with preference to Oakland and Bay Area students.

Indiana University Scholarship – Students from the state of Indiana, with preference to those planning to attend Indiana University.

Greater Siouxland Iowa Chapter Scholarship - Students from the state of Iowa who plan to teach.

J. Arnold Webb Scholarship – Student must enroll in a historically black college or university listed at www2.ed.gov/about/inits/list/whhbcu/edlite-list.html.

Kersey/Oglesby Family Scholarship – Students preparing to major in elementary education or early childhood education with preference to male students from Indiana, Kentucky, North Carolina, Ohio, South Carolina, Tennessee, Virginia, or West Virginia.

Montclair State University Chapter Scholarship – Students living in North New Jersey.

The Central Ohio Higher Education Scholarship – Sigma Chapter, Ohio State University Endowed Fund – Students living in the Central Ohio Area of Franklin, Delaware, Licking, Union, Madison, Pickaway, and Fairfield counties with preference to students majoring in education at Otterbein University, Ohio State University, Capital University or Ohio Dominican University.

Petermichel Family Fund – Catholic students with preference to those who are members of any of the following Catholic parishes: St. Patrick's in Cairo, Illinois; Pope Pius X in Chula Vista, California; or St. Vincent's in Bedford, Indiana; Holy Spirit Parish at Geist, Fishers Indiana, or who are students at Bedford North Lawrence High School or Monroe County Community high schools in Indiana.
