

Calculating Unweighted GPA

The GPA (Grade Point Average) is a measure of overall academic strength. The weighted GPA is reported on your transcript.

Semester grades for all courses taken during high school will be recorded on the transcript and used to calculate the GPA.

No additional weighting will be given to any course for GPA purposes. For example, if a student makes a 93 in a Pre-AP course, the semester grade will be recorded as an exact 93 and averaged with all other semester grades to determine the GPA.

The GPA **does not include** grades for high school courses taken outside of the usual high school day. This includes credits earned through:

Middle school (designated by a "J" after the course on the transcript)

Correspondence (designated by a "C" after the course on the transcript)

Summer school (designated by a "R" after the course on the transcript)

Credit-by-exam (designated by an "E" or "T" after the course on the transcript)

Dual enrollment (designated by a "D" after the course on the transcript)

Example:	<u>Course</u>	<u>Grade</u>	<u>4-Point Conversion</u>
	English I Pre-AP	88	3
	Algebra I	90	4
	Biology I	92	4
	World Geography Pre-AP	86	3
	P.E.	97	4
	<u>Latin II</u>	<u>94</u>	<u>4</u>
	TOTAL	547	22

547 divided by 6 (# of classes) = **91.16 GPA** (100 point scale)
22 divided by 6 (# of courses) = **3.66 GPA** (4.0 scale)

91.26 is the unweighted GPA.
3.66 is the student's unweighted GPA converted to a 4-point scale.

Calculating Unweighted GPA on a 4-Point Scale

Occasionally a college or academic program will ask for a student's GPA on a 4-point scale. Westlake High School does not calculate their GPA on this scale; however, you can easily calculate it on your own.

Use the same grades used in calculating an unweighted GPA normally. Assign each grade the following points.

<u>Grade on WHS' 100-point scale</u>	<u>Grade on a 4-point scale</u>
100—90	4
89—80	3
79—75	2
74—70	1
Below 69	0
