

SAT Accommodations Request

To apply for SAT testing accommodations:

1. A current IEP/504 plan in place for at least 4 months which includes the accommodations for which you are applying.
2. A professional evaluation with cognitive ability (IQ) test scores within the last 10 years.
3. A professional evaluation with academic achievement test scores within the last 5 years.

* Families need to turn in the signed consent form from College Board to your Counselor.

* The approval process may take up to 8 weeks

* Once approved, the accommodations are in effect for all College Board tests (SAT/AP/PSAT) and no more paperwork needs to be done.

* WHS will help facilitate the process, however, the decision is solely made by College Board and **approval is not guaranteed** even if your student currently receives test accommodations at WHS.

Make sure that you read through the documentation requirements for your specific case and ensure that we have the necessary paperwork prior to your request.

ACT Accommodations Request

ACT accommodations have a different process than the SAT with College Board. ACT accommodations requests are made at the time of registration for the test. See your counselor at least 3 weeks prior to the testing registration date to request accommodations.

The student must have a current IEP/504 plan in place at school and the documentation required by ACT.

Read the attached chart that explains the accommodations request options. National Testing Day Accommodations are for National Testing Days only. If students are approved for Special Testing, these tests are given during the week and during the school day. Students will miss class for Special Testing Accommodations.
